Croatian HE system



QA in Croatian HE system – responsibility of a single public agency – Agency for Science and Higher Education



- 10 universities (8 public and 2 private)
- 15 polytechnics (11 public and 4 private)
- 25 colleges (3 public, 22 private)
- 180,000 students



Croatian QA Agency (ASHE)



 2005 – establishment of ASHE; development of QA model in line with the Standards and Guidelines for QA in the European Higher Education Area (ESG) using best international practices

2017 – renewal of ENQA/EQAR membership

ASHE accreditation – past and current activities



2005-2009

Accreditation of all study programmes (1200) adjusted to Bologna principles (3+2+3 scheme and ECTS system)

2009-2016

Re-accreditation of all HEIs (130) – FIRST CYCLE

Initial accreditation of new HEIs (1) and programmes (50)

2016/2017

Re-accreditation of all PhD studies (130)





Re-accreditation of HEIs in the first cycle



- Mandatory for all public and private HEIs in five-year cycles (130 HEIs in the last 5 years)
- In line with the ESG 2005

- Scope: minimal criteria (accountability) and quality grade with recommendations for improvement (enhancement)
- Model: combined (institutional and programme) evaluation





Re-accreditation of HEIs – outcomes



130 accreditation recommendations:

- accreditation granted to 76 HEIs
- letter of expectation issued to 51 HEIs
- accreditation denied to 3 HEIs and 25 study programmes

- + recommendations for improvements (action plans and reports on improvements)
- + publication of all reports (full and summary)





Recommendations for quality improvement



- Strategic documents/HEI management
- Internal quality assurance mechanisms
- Learning outcomes, ECTS credits
- Student internship
- Graduate employability tracking
- Revising enrolment quotas
- Teacher/student ratio
- Courses delivered by teachers employed at HEIs
- Mobility and international cooperation
- Scientific productivity.





A review of the carried out re-accreditation of HEIs



- Strengths/weaknesses
- Feedback from HEIs and expert panel members (surveys)
- Survey on the impact of external evaluation procedures on higher education.



Re-accreditation of HEIs in the second cycle



Major changes in the new re-accreditation model:

- Quality standards adjusted to new ESG, esp. regarding ESG 1.2 (learning outcomes and connection to CQF), ESG 1.3 (student-centred learning, teaching and assessment) and ESG 1.5 (competencies and professional development of teachers / staff)
- Emphasis on improvements based on recommendations from the 1st cycle
- Shift from inputs to outputs
- Smaller number of standards; standard descriptions, indicators and evidence examples included
- Quantitative standards included in the quality grade
- Introduction of 'key standards'
- Improved IT system for the input of quantitative data (MOZVAG)
- Improved assessment / decision making based on assessment
- Revised re-accreditation procedure
- Planned pilot procedure at 7 HEIs
- Training





ASHE accreditation – plans for future activities



<u>2017 – 2023</u>

Re-accreditation of all HEIs (130) – SECOND CYCLE

- Mandatory for all private and public HEIs
- In line with ESG 2015
- Model: institutional re-accreditation (outcomes on the level of institutions)

Evaluation of study programmes

- Voluntary
- Checking of compliance with CROQF qualification standards
- Model: programme re-accreditation (outcomes on the level of programmes)
- Outcome: enrolment of programme into CROQF Register ('quality brand')

Initial accreditation of new HEIs and programmes
