

External Quality Assurance until 2012

Different agencies & different approaches

- Fachhochschul-Council (FHR): Accreditation and supervision of the Universities of Applied Sciences since 1993
- Accreditation Council (ÖAR): Accreditation and supervision of Private Universities since 1999
- Agency for Quality Assurance (AQA): Public Universities could voluntarily get Quality Audits since 2004

2012 AQ Austria is founded on the basis of merger of the three predecessor organisations, as a result of a legal reform.



Major reform in 2012: The HS-QSG

Law on Quality Assurance in Higher Education (Hochschul-Qualitätssicherungsgesetz HS-QSG):

- AQ Austria: established as part of a reorganisation as an independent institution and legal entity under public law responsible for external QA in the entire Austrian Higher Education sector.
- Principles and procedures: adressing all Higher education institutions except Teacher training colleges
- Notification of Cross-Border Degree Programmes


AQ Austria: principles & setup

Core principles in accordance with ESG:

- Legal foundation: organisational setup and type of procedures defined but not standards and criteria
- Independence: in particular as regards standards, procedures and decisions
- Stakeholder Involvement: within the governance of AQ Austria
- European / International activity: international accreditations, ERASMUS+ projects, member of CEENQA, ENQA, EQAR, BFUG, etc., and foreign experts in the Board of AQ Austria as well as within the peer-review procedures

AQ Austria: scope of tasks

- Higher education institutions are autonomous, main responsibility for quality
- External quality assurance is necessity, added value & aims at quality development
- Cooperation = communication & reliability

Tasks:

- development and implementation of external quality assurance procedures
- audit and accreditation procedures, according to national and international standards
- supervision of accredited HEI and degree programmes regarding accreditation requirements
- > studies and system analyses as well as information, advice and consultancy
- international cooperation and notification of cross-border degree programmes

AQ Austria: procedures & type of HEI

- Private Higher Education Institutions
- Universities of Applied Sciences
- Foreign HEIs
- Once only for all types and valid for 6 years

Accreditation of programmes

- Private Higher Education Institutions
- Limited for the duration of institutional accreditation
- Universities of Applied Sciences
- Unlimited
- Public Universities:
- •Only voluntary accreditation, valid for 6 years
- Foreign HEIs
- Valid for 6 years

Re-Accreditation of HEI

- Private Higher Education Institutions
- •Valid for 6-12 years
- Universities of Applied Sciences:
- After being accredited for 6 years switch to audit scheme
- Foreign HEIs
- Valid for 6 years

Audits

- Universities of Applied Sciences
- Public Universities
- Foreign HEIs
- For all types valid for 7 years




Accreditation



Basic assumptions

- → Does the HEI meet externally set, quantitative & qualitative standards?
- → Experts in peer-reviews as critical friends
- → Since 2021: conditions for initial accreditation possible
- → In every case: focus on quality assurance & quality development
 - → Different areas of focus: <u>Institutional Accreditation</u> & <u>Programme Accreditation</u>




Legal framework

- Official procedures based Administrative Law
- Decision Period 9 months
- Obligation to publish results
- Control mechanisms in certain cases



Audit

- Review of the institutional quality management system, its organisation and performance in core areas of the HEI, see <u>areas of assessment</u>
- HEI have free choice of Agency





Notification of foreign degree programmes

- **Programmes are notified** (*not recognized!*) if the offering HEI is recognized in the home country
- If the programme is offered by collaborating with an Austrian educational institution the Austrian partner has to be evaluated
- Criteria refer to whether the partner guarantees high quality provision of those parts of the programme he conducts. The programme as such is not reviewed

Legal framework and procedures:

- → §27 HS-QSG: AQ Austria as reporting office, keeps a register of reporting procedures; task with official character
- → §27a EU/EEA Provider: Desktop procedure; low reporting effort; Confidence principle: European quality assurance
- → §27b non-EU/EEA: Peer-review procedure; Assessment criteria based on accreditation; Assessment mostly at Austrian cooperation partners

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

AQ Austria: definitions

Accreditation - is legally defined as a formal and transparent quality review procedure, based on defined criteria & standards, leading to state recognition of a higher education institution and/or of study programme

→ Universities of Applied Sciences, Private HEIs (Private Universities and Private University Colleges)

Audit & Certification - Certification is legally defined as the formal certificate documenting the conformity of an educational institution's quality management system with pre-defined criteria and standards involves reviewing and certifying a higher education institution's internal quality management system as well as providing support in continued development of that system

→ applies to all types of HEIs

Areas of assessment for institutional accreditation

- objectives and profile
- development planning
- degree programmes and teaching
- (applied) research and development
- organisation of the higher education institution and its activities
- funding and resources
- national and international cooperations
- quality management system





Programme Accrediation, areas of assessment

Areas of assessment for programme accreditation

- degree programme and its management
- staff
- quality assurance
- funding and infrastructure
- applied research and development
- national and international cooperation





Audit, areas of assessment

Areas of assessment for programme accreditation

- quality strategy and its integration into the management of the HEI
- quality assurance structures and procedures in the areas of degree programmes and teaching, (applied) research or advancement of the arts, organisation and administration and staff
- integration of internationalisation and societal objectives into the QM system
- information systems and involvement of stakeholder groups
- quality assurance structures and procedures for certificate programmes for further education offered by providers of University of Applied Sciences
